Guide for Saving Files from iPad PLD to a Thumbdrive

Please note that the list is non-exhaustive and based on commonly used applications by schools.

What to Prepare

Things You Need to Save Files on Your Thumbdrive

Before proceeding with factory reset of your PLDs, you will need to:

- Have one thumbdrive that is empty (recommend to be about 64 GB if you have many applications with files to be saved)
- Apple connector that can connect the thumbdrive to the iPad.







How to Save onto the Thumbdrive

- 1. Launch the Photos app.
- 2. Tap Select (top right-hand corner).
- 3. Choose the photos you want to save.
- 4. Tap the share icon (usually a square with an arrow pointing upward).
- 5. Select Save to Files.
- 6. Wait until the files are downloaded.
- 7. Locate the Backup folder or choose a different location.
- 8. Create a new folder and rename it to Photo Backup.
- 9. You should see the folder is empty, but the number of files that are ready to be saved will be at the bottom.
- 10. Tap Save.
- 11. Locate Photo Backup Long press (Press and hold)
- 12. Tap Compress.
- 13. Tap "Archive" folder and select "Move"
- 14. Select Location > "On My iPad" > Backup_<date> > Photo Backup.
- 15. Tap Backup folder to transfer the zip file.

How to Restore the Files After Factory Reset

- 1. Open the Photos app on your iPad, then tap Import.
- 2. Select the photos and videos you want to import, then select your import destination.

Note

Import all items: Tap Import All.

Import selected items: Tap the items you want to import (a checkmark appears for each), tap Import, then tap Import Selected.

 Launch Freeform App. Open the file you want to transfer, click the arrow ▼ next to the title for the file Export as PDF. Save to Files. Save "On my iPad". Location> On my iPad > Backup_<date> > Freeform Backup. If this is the first time, create a new folder and name it Freeform Backup. </date> Wait for the Freeform to be saved. Repeat the process until you have complete all the wanted files. 	 Launch the Files app on your iPad. Tap On my iPad. Navigate to Backup_<date>> Freeform Backup.</date> Locate the exported PDF files you saved earlier. Tap and hold the PDF file you want to restore. Tap Move. Select the location where you want to move the file (e.g., back to the Freeform app folder or another location).



Keynote, Pages, Numbers, Garage Band Reality Composer

 Launch the Files app. Tap "On my iPad". Locate Keynote (Folder) - Long press (Press and hold). Tap Compress. Tap "Archive" folder and select "Move". Select Location > "On My iPad". Tap Backup_<date> to transfer the zip file.</date> Repeat the process for Numbers (Folder) Pages (Folder), Reality Composer (Folder), GarageBand for IOS (Folder) 	 Launch the Files app. Tap On my iPad. Navigate to Backup_<date>. (be sure you are to move all files from your USB fies to "on my iPad".</date> Locate the respective zip file (e.g., Numbers.zip, Pages.zip, Reality Composer.zip, GarageBand for iOS.zip). Tap and hold the zip file. Tap Uncompress. The uncompressed folder should appear in the same location. Tap and hold the uncompressed folder. Tap Move. Select the location On My iPad. Move the folder back to its original location or the desired location.



How to Save onto the Thumbdrive

- 1. Launch the iMovie app.
- 2. Open the project you want to transfer.
- Tap the share icon (usually a square with an arrow pointing upward).
- 4. Tap Export Project.
- 5. Select Save to Files.
- 6. Location > On my iPad > Backup_<date > iMovie Backup
- 7. If this is the first time, create a new folder and name it iMovie Backup.
- 8. Tap Save.

How to Restore the Files After Factory Reset

- 1. Open the Files app on your iPad.
- 2. Navigate to Backup_<date> > iMovie Backup. (be sure this is copy on your "On my iPad").
- 3. Find the exported iMovie project files you saved earlier.
- 4. Tap and hold the project file you want to restore.
- 5. Tap Share and select Open in iMovie.
- 6. If you don't see the Open in iMovie option, you might need to select Copy to iMovie or a similar option, depending on your iOS version.

OR

- 1. Launch the iMovie app on your iPad.
- 2. Go to the Projects screen.
- 3. Tap the "+" icon to create a new project.
- 4. Select Movie.
- 5. Tap the Import icon.
- 6. Navigate to the Files app location where your project is saved. (if it is on thumb drive, please make sure you plug in otherwise drag the backup folder to "on my iPad"
- 7. Select the project file to import it into iMovie.

 Under the project name, choose Project. Save to Files Select Location> On my iPad > Backup_<date> >Clips Backup folder. If this is the first time, create a new folder and name it Clips Backup.</date> 	4. Choose the clips you want to restore.

3. Tap Export (first icon on the top left).	Backup.

How to Save onto the Thumbdrive

- 1. Open your padlet and click the Share arrow in the action bar.
- 2. Scroll down and to the Export options.
- 3. Click your preferred file format and adjust the settings if needed. Now you have exported your padlet.

Save as image

1. This option will export your padlet as a PNG file.

Save as PDF

- 1. For this option, you will need to choose your preferred page size and orientation. You will also need to decide if you'd like a Handout or Slides. Then click Generate to complete the export.
- 2. *A Handout will generate your padlet just as it sounds with your posts on a paper. Slides will generate each slide on a page in PDF form. With Slides you can decide if you'd like the background included or excluded.
- 3. Once the PDF loads in a new tab, click the download button in the upper right corner.
- 4. The attachments of your exported PDF are fully functional, so you can click any attachment to load it in a new window.

Save as CSV

1. This will download your padlet as a CSV file. You can use Numbers on a Mac or Microsoft Excel to open this file.

Save as Excel spreadsheet

1. This will download your padlet as an XLSX spreadsheet file. This exported spreadsheet will contain as many as four detailed worksheets depending on the contents of your padlet: Posts, Comments, Reactions and Summary. Attachments on the padlet will be linked directly on the exported spreadsheet.

How to Restore the Files After Factory Reset

How to transfer PDFs to your iPad.

- 1. Open iTunes.
- 2. Click on Device and select Books.
- 3. Drag and drop the PDFs into your iTunes Books library.
- 4. Sync your iPad to your newly updated iTunes Books library.
 You can sync all your files or select them individually.
- 5. Click Apply to begin the file transfer.



How to Save onto the Thumbdrive

Exporting the current canvas

- 1. Tap Info Settings icon, then Save.
- 2. Tap Export to Files .The browser lets you edit the name of the export. This name is only applied to the export and is not assigned to your piece in Sketchbook. If the file had been previously saved and given a name in the Sketchbook Gallery, that name will be applied in the dialog.
- 3. Once you tap SAVE, the dialog will dismiss and you will return to Sketchbook.

Exporting multiple canvases from the Gallery

- 1. In the Gallery, pinch-zoom out or tap to enter small thumbnail view.
- 2. Tap Select in the lower left corner, and select the files you want to export.
- 3. Tap menu and choose Share or Export to Files.
- 4. Share will give you the option to choose TIFF or PNG.
- 5. Export to Files will export TIFF.

Import from Files

- 1. Tap File icon, then select Import from Files Gallery. This will launch the iOS Files browser, where you can browse files on your device or on any cloud storage you have enabled on your device.
- 2. Tap the file to import.

How to Save onto the Thumbdrive

- 1. Open the app.
- 2. Select File or select multiple if it allows.
- 3. Export Files by tap the Share icon (choose appropriate files if you can).
- 4. Save to files Choose location On My iPad Location > On my iPad > Backup_<date>.
- 5. Best if you can organise the backup folder by the application hence if this is the first time, create a new folder and name it appropriately (e.g., Backup_<date>, App Backup).
- 6. Tap Save and wait for the copying process to complete.
