


POLICE ADVISORY FOR PARENTS/GUARDIANS

Dear Parents/Guardians,

In this edition of our Police Advisory, we would like to highlight the re-emergence of phishing scam cases involving the use of <u>spoofed emails from Netflix</u>.

- 2. In this variant, the victims would receive emails purportedly from a trusted source such as Netflix. The scammers would deceive the recipients into clicking on the URL link provided for renewal of their membership.
- 3. Upon clicking on the URL links, victims would be directed to phishing websites where they are requested to furnish their banking credentials and OTPs.
- 4. Victims would only realise that they have been scammed when they discover unauthorised transactions made using their credit or debit card.

5. How to protect yourself from such scams:

- > Do not click on URL links provided in unsolicited emails and text messages.
- Always verify the authenticity of the information with the official website or sources.
- Never disclose personal/banking credentials and OTPs to anyone or unverified sources.
- Report any unauthorised banking charges to your bank and cancel your card immediately.
- > Report to the Police if you are a victim.
